



Selah is a 4-5 year old Australian Cattle Dog that was rescued from a kill shelter in Southern California in August. She came to us as a foster when she was rejected by the other dogs she lived with at her first post-shelter home. We are charmed by her but not in a position to offer her a forever home.

The Pros: Selah is loyal, playful, loving, and athletic, obedient, and very eager to please. She is housebroken, comes when she is called (very quickly!), sits, and is up to date on all her shots. She is ok with cats and other dogs once properly introduced. She follows the rules indoors and out - stays off the furniture, does not leave the unfenced yard, does not chew or dig.

The Cons: Selah is fearfully aggressive with new people. It takes her a while to warm up to most people and she has been known to bark, growl, and bite (usually nipping at feet) in a way that makes folks uncomfortable. She is a bit anxious, can be bossy with other dogs, and needs a strong human leader to keep her in her place.

Ideal Home: Selah would be best suited to a home where her owners are familiar with the ACD breed and where she can have a supportive environment while being trained and socialized. She needs exercise and mental stimulation. Older kids and mellow dogs would be ideal if any. She loves men and likes to follow workers around throughout their day. She would be a fantastic farm guard dog or work buddy for a self employed loner.
